From Glenn's Corner

Blueberry Stuffed French Toast, Serves 9-12

12 slices of thick bread (Texas Toast), 2-8 ounce packages of cream cheese, 1C Blueberries – fresh or frozen, 10 Eggs, $\frac{1}{3}$ C Maple Syrup, 2C Milk; **Sauce:** 1C water, 1C sugar, 2T cornstarch, 2C blueberries, fresh or frozen, 1T butter

Remove crusts from the bread and cube. Spray the bottom of 9" x 13" glass baking dish with vegetable spray and place half the cubes of bread in the pan. Cube the cream cheese and put on top of the bread. Distribute the blueberries over the cream cheese and top with the remaining bread cubes. Beat eggs, add maple syrup and milk. Pour over the bread and cheese, cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate overnight.

In the morning, preheat oven to 350 degrees. Remove plastic, cover with aluminum foil and bake for 30 minutes. Remove foil and bake for an additional 30 minutes. Remove from oven and let sit 10 minutes while making the sauce. Cook the water, cornstarch, sugar and 1C of blueberries until it thickens. Then add 1C blueberries and the butter stir to combine. Serve over slices of toast.

My Greenwood tie has provided me recently with undoubtedly the most sublime musical experience of my life. A couple of years ago I was chatting at a cook-out in the Berkshires with Greenwood alumna Emily Ma and her father. The latter had not realized I was a Greenwood alumnus, and asked me if I still played chamber music. I said I didn't, and in response to his query said that the reason was that I don't practice. He said that shouldn't make any difference, and I assured him it did (I was 70 years old at the time.) He then said, "Well I'm coming over to your home and we're going to play together. Pick your piece." When I ascertained he wasn't joking, I picked myself off the floor and named my piece. Which is how, several months later, I had the incredible experience of playing the Beethoven Op. 69 Cello and Piano sonata (it's actually a Piano and Violoncello Sonata), in my living room, with Yo-Yo Ma. (I had, you'll be glad to know, practiced it.)

All three joined 101 musicians from over 30 countries to make up the YouTube Symphony Orchestra 2011 playing a spectacular Grand Finale concert at Sydney Opera House. The musicians met for a weeklong celebration of music in Sydney culminating in the Grand Finale featuring animated visuals on the interior and exterior projections by Obscura Digital on the iconic sails, all synchronized to the music of the YouTube Symphony Orchestra 2011's performance and conducted by YouTube Symphony Orchestra Artistic Advisor Michael Tilson Thomas.
